JELAJAH MALAYSIA 2009 19 to 26 April, 2009

SPECIFIC REGULATIONS

ARTICLE 1. ORGANIZATION

The Jelajah Malaysia is organized by Ten Speed Events Sdn. Bhd, A-5-1, Plaza Mon't Kiara, Jalan Kiara, 50480 Kuala Lumpur under the regulations of the International Cycling Union. It is to be held from 19-26 April, 2009.

ARTICLE 2. TYPE OF EVENT

The event is open to athletes of the Men's Elite and Under 23 categories. The event is entered on the UCI Asian Tour calendar and is registered as a class 2.2 event. In conformity with the UCI rules, points are awarded as follows for the UCI Men's Elite and Under 23 (refer to Art.2.11.014) ranking:

General Individual classification by time ranking 1 – 8 (40, 30, 16, 12, 10, 8, 6, 3)

Stage winner to the first 3 riders on each stage (8, 5, 2)

Stage Leader Jersey for General individual classification by time @ 4 points daily

ARTICLE 3. PARTICIPATION

As per article 2.2.005 of the UCI regulations, the event is open to the following teams: UCI Professional Continental teams, UCI Continental Teams, National Teams, regional teams and Clubs. As per article 2.2.003 of the UCI regulations, teams must be formed of a minimum of four (4) riders and a maximum of six (6) riders together with three (3) officials.

ARTICLE 4. RACE HEADQUARTERS

At the start, the race headquarters shall be open starting from 13 April 2009 to 16 April 2009 from 0900hrs to 2100hrs and located at the following address: No. 1 Lorong Raja Uda 2, Kampung Bharu, 50300 Kuala Lumpur and from 17 April 2009 to 18 April, 2009 from 0900hrs to 2100hrs at Gallery 6, Level 3, Concorde Hotel Shah Alam, No.3 Jalan Tengku Ampuan Zabedah, 40100 Shah Alam, Selangor Darul Ehsan.

Team representatives are requested to confirm their starters and collect their race numbers at the Commissaires' Room from 1030hrs to 1130hrs on 18 April 2009, located at Gallery 7, Level 3, Concorde Hotel Shah Alam, No.3 Jalan Tengku Ampuan Zabedah, 40100 Shah Alam, Selangor Darul Ehsan. *(Managers are kindly reminded to bring along their teams' 2009 licenses and team jersey for inspection)*

The team managers' meeting, organized in accordance with article 1.2.087 of the UCI regulations, in the presence of the Members of the Commissaires' Panel, is scheduled for 1200hrs – 1300hrs, 18 April 2009 at Gallery 7, Level 3, Concorde Hotel Shah Alam, No.3 Jalan Tengku Ampuan Zabedah, 40100 Shah Alam, Selangor Darul Ehsan.

ARTICLE 5. RADIO-TOUR

Race information will be broadcast on the frequency of Radio Tour channel at 143.7125mghz.

ARTICLE 6. NEUTRAL TECHNICAL SUPPORT

The technical support service is handled by Ten Speed Neutral Service.

The neutral support is taken care of by means of 3 Sedan Cars, and will carry 10-speed and 9-speed Mavic wheels as spare wheels.

ARTICLE 7. RACE INCIDENTS OCCURRING IN THE LAST 3 KILOMETERS

In the case of a duly noted fall, puncture or mechanical problem after passing the red triangle, the rider(s) involved shall be credited with the time of the rider(s) in whose company they were riding at the moment of the accident. His or their placing shall be determined by the order in which he or they actually cross the finishing line.

If, as the result of a fall beyond the red triangle, a rider cannot cross the finish line, he shall be placed last in the stage and credited with the time of the rider or riders in whose company he was riding at the time of the accident.

ARTICLE 8. FINISHING TIME LIMITS

Taking into account the characteristics of each stage, the finishing time limits have been set as follows: Stages 1-2-4-5-6 & 8 @ 10% and stages 3 and 7 @ 12%.

The time limit may, in exceptional circumstances, be increased by the Commissaires' Panel in agreement with the organizer according to the article 2.6.032.

ARTICLE 9. FEEDING

Food and drinks may be taken from team vehicles after 30km from the actual start each day and up to 10km before the finish behind the car of the Commissaire or as otherwise indicated by the Commissaire.

ARTICLE 10. CLASSIFICATIONS - TIME BONUSES

The following classifications will be issued:

Daily classifications:

Daily Individual Stage 1st – 20th placing with Time bonuses @ 10", 6", 4" (for 1-3 winner)

Daily individual Stage for Malaysian riders for 1 – 10

Daily Sprint Stage 1-3 with time bonuses @ 3", 2", 1" (for 1-3 winner and points for 1-4 winners @ 5, 3, 2, 1)

King of the Mountains at Stage 3 and 7 for 1 – 3 with time bonuses @ 3"-2"-1"(KOM Cat.1 only) and points as below:-

Category of climbing:-

- a. Category 1 – 8, 6, 5, 3, 2, 1
- b. Category 2 – 6, 4, 2, 1
- c. Categories 3 & 4 – 3, 2, 1

Individual General Classifications:

Individual General Classification by Time for 1 – 20

Individual General Classification by Points (Sprint) for 1 – 5

Individual General Classification for King of the Mountains for 1 – 5

Individual General Classification by Time for a Malaysian rider for 1 – 5

Team General Classification:

Team General Classification by Time for 1 – 5

Team General Classification by Time for a Malaysian team 1-3

The Tie-break procedures for the classifications are as below:-

Article 2.6.015 to 2.6.017 are taken into consideration.

ARTICLE 11. PRIZES

The following prizes are awarded:

A grand total of RM 281,130.00 (approx. USD 76,000) will be awarded in prize money at the event and will be paid in Malaysian Ringgit currency. The prize money can be collected on the last day of the event or as advised by the organizer later.

ARTICLE 12. ANTI DOPING

The UCI anti doping regulations are entirely applicable to the event. Riders and Teams Official must check and be aware whether they are required for any daily anti doping controls. Place and address of Anti doping room will be determined by UCI Anti doping Inspector during the teams manager meeting and the teams manager shall refer to the race manual for the location of the doping control center.

ARTICLE 13. AWARDS CEREMONY

In accordance with article 1.2.112 of the UCI rules, the following riders must attend the official awards ceremony:

- The top three (3) finishers of the stage
- The leaders of the following secondary classifications:
 - Individual General Classification by Time for a Malaysian Rider (White jersey)
 - Individual King of the Mountains Classification (Polka Dot Jersey)
 - Individual General Classification by Points (Green Jersey)
 - Individual General Classification by Time (Yellow Jersey)

The riders will present themselves at the podium within a time limit of ten (10) minutes after crossing the finish line.

Before each stage start (after the 1st Stage), the jersey holders must appear in racing clothing for presentation to the public.

Moreover, at the general finish of the event, the following riders must also present themselves at the final awards ceremony :

- The first 3 of the event
- The winners of the following secondary classifications:
 - The Individual General Classification by Time 1 – 3
 - The Individual General Classification by Points 1 – 3
 - The Individual King of the Mountains Classification 1- 3
 - The Individual General Classification by Time for a Malaysian rider 1 – 3
 - The Team General Team Classification 1 – 3
 - The Team General Team Classification for Malaysian teams 1 - 3

ARTICLE 14. PENALTIES

The UCI penalty scale is the only one applicable.
